Call for Applications for the International Workshop "Diasporas in Eurasia"

and Graduate School of Letters, Kyoto University

## I. Theme:

The movement of people within Eurasia has been one of the main features shaping the human lives from ancient times until today. In this workshop, we will look at the current/historical condition of movement of people and/or the role that diasporic populations have played in transforming societies and cultures across Eurasia and in the way they have provided content to what we now often refer to broadly as the "Asian region." How have diaspora communities been formed and have changed over time? What is the role of such diaspora communities in the transformation of their home communities? To what extent and by what means did they preserve their identity even when far away? What kind of networks and connections did they create between their original homelands and distant places?

This graduate students' workshop will be both historically and contemporarily oriented, and will embody different methodologies and disciplines. We look for case studies as well as more general theoretical and comparative considerations. Selected participants from outside of Israel will be offered accommodations and meals for the days of the conference. Organizers will provide travel grant up to three students including airfare and hotel accommodation for three nights and minimum per diem.

The workshop will be hosted by the Institute for Asian and African Studies at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, in collaboration with Heidelberg University (Germany) and Kyoto University (Japan), as part of an ongoing effort to encourage cooperation in the realms of Asian and Middle Eastern Studies between these universities.
